TIERNAN KENNY - COIMISIÚN NA MEÁN

Tiernan Kenny is director of communications and public affairs at Coimisiún na Meán (CNAM). CNAM are the Irish media regulator, responsible for Ireland's Online Safety Framework. This important framework will hold digital services accountable for how they protect people, especially children, from harm online.



SINÉAD GIBNEY - SOCIAL DEMOCRATS

Sinéad is the Social Democrats TD for Dublin-Rathdown. She founded and led the corporate social responsibility function for Google Ireland. Sinéad currently sits on the Oireachtas AI Joint Committee and is a strong voice for the regulation of big tech.

Conor's work focuses on grassroots political, trade union, arts, and community movements. Conor has written extensively about the workings of the Irish economy and the influence of colonialism on our current relationship to multinational corporations.

Paul is a People Before Profit TD. Paul has been a long term campaigner for housing, workers' rights and climate justice. He currently sits on the Oireachtas AI Joint Committee and advocates for the regulation of big tech and putting people and planet before private profit.
